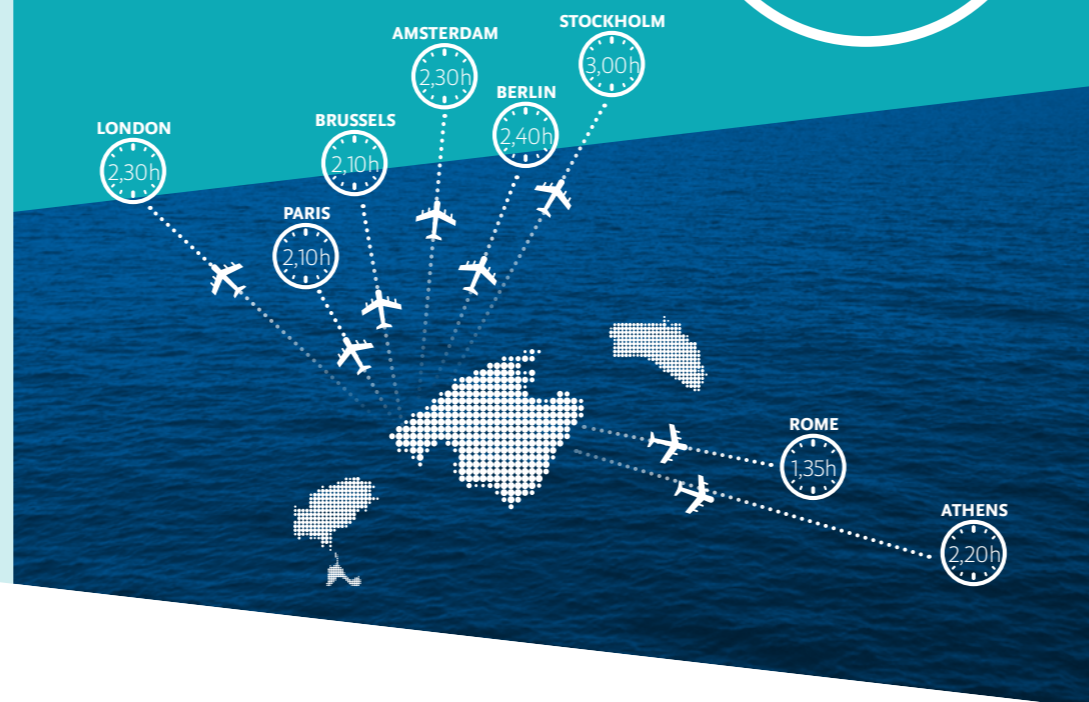
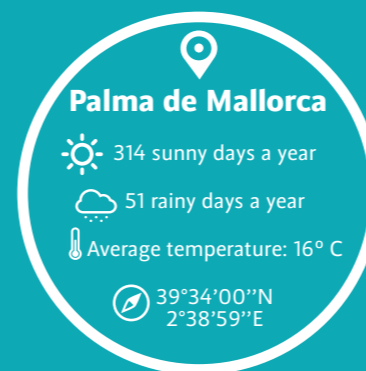
The Degree in Primary Education is one of the programmes included in RD 1393/2007 of 29th October, Chapter III, Art. 12.9, as it qualifies graduates to work in a regulated professional activity in Spain. The conditions it fulfills are set out in the Resolution of 17th December 2007 from the Secretary of State for Universities and Research and Order ECI/3857/2007 of 27th December whereby the requirements for verification of official university titles that qualify graduates for Primary School Teaching are established. It is, therefore, an essential degree in order to work as a teacher of children aged 6-12 in the Spanish education system.

This programme fundamentally aims to train future teachers in primary school education. Society today requires qualified professionals for the teaching profession who not only pass on knowledge, but who are also able to transmit values and attitudes through their teaching methods. In this sense, and in very general terms, students will need to acquire:

- ➔ **Cross-cutting skills** that include core, personal, interpersonal and systemic skills.
- ➔ **Socio-psycho-pedagogical skills** linked to learning and personal development, education processes and context, and society, family and school life.
- ➔ **Didactic and disciplinary skills** linked to the science of teaching and specific knowledge in the different primary school curriculum areas: experimental sciences, social sciences, mathematics, languages (Catalan, Spanish and English), music, plastic and visual arts, and physical education.

Finally, students will also need to attain practical skills related to all of the above.

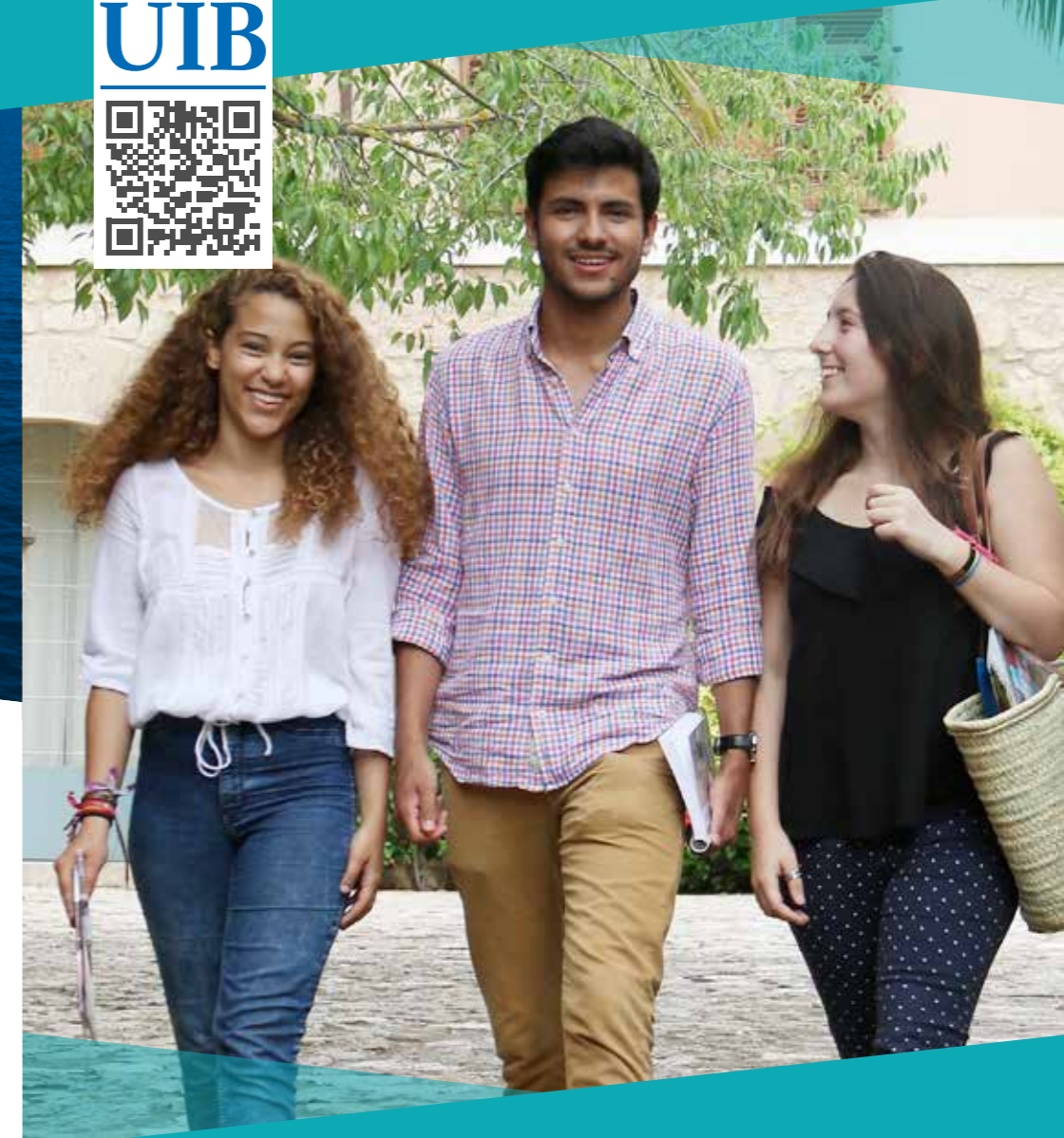

WHAT IS IT MADE UP OF?

The main objective of this study programme is to train future **teachers** who will work in the **primary schooling system**.

WHAT WILL YOU LEARN?

Students will acquire interdisciplinary **competences** that include fundamental, personal, interpersonal, and systematic abilities. They will learn psycho-socio-pedagogical skills related to the learning and development of personality, educational processes and contexts, society, family, and school. Students will be taught teaching disciplines, and they will acquire the ability to understand, speak, and write in English.

WHAT WILL YOU BE ABLE TO DO ONCE YOU FINISH?

- ➔ The Degree in Primary Education certifies graduates to work as primary school teachers.
- ➔ The degree enables access to the speciality of Educational Guidance and Counselling if students have taken the University Masters in Teaching Training.
- ➔ Other academic pathways from the selection of current postgraduate courses and PhD programmes are open to graduates.

HIGH-QUALITY OFFICIAL STUDY

Legislation requires that official Spanish Degrees receive positive evaluations by the **National Agency for Quality Assessment and Accreditation (ANECA)**. This process is called verification, and it serves to ensure that the development programme in which you will participate will provide the skills and learning results that it is supposed to. Bachelor's programmes are subject to assessment and are continuously improved upon in order to guarantee their prestige and recognition within Europe.

TRAVEL AND LEARN

The UIB offers students the chance to take part in different exchange and mobility programmes:

- ➔ **Exchange and mobility programmes:** to complete part of your studies at another university in Spain, the European Union, and around the world, or to get work experience at businesses in the European Union, managed by the International Relations Service.
- ➔ **Volunteer work experience and projects** with university development cooperation programmes in least developed countries, run through the development cooperation programmes managed by the Cooperation for Development and Solidarity Office.
