

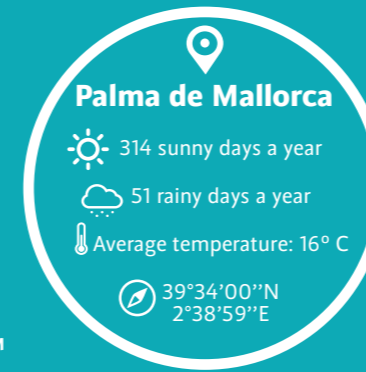
Study at the UIB

The **Degree in Early Childhood Education** is one of the undergraduate degrees established by Royal Decree 1393/2007 of 29 October, Chapter III, Article 12.9, that enable one to perform a regulated profession in Spain. The conditions that must be met are laid out in the Resolution, of 17 December 2007, of the State Secretary for Universities and Research and in Order ECI/3854/2007, of 27 December, which establishes the requirements for the verification of official university degrees that allow for the profession of Early Childhood Education Teacher to be practiced.

The main aim of the programme is to train students as early childhood teachers, working on the acquisition of a set of skills including:

- ➔ **Personal-relationship skills** that include the ability to promote social harmony and pacific conflict resolution; developing strategies for collaborative work that develops respect for different perspectives and for diversity; developing a committed attitude towards the profession, and the ability to promote educational values that defend gender equality and encourage the culture of peace.
- ➔ **Academic-disciplinary skills** such as the ability to analyse the educational implications of information and communication technology; analysing and developing the goals, syllabus content and assessment criteria for early childhood education, and knowing the evolutionary development and requirements of children in early childhood.
- ➔ **Professional skills** linked to the ability to cover language learning in multicultural and multilingual contexts, as well as the ability to understand, speak and write in English; the ability to create, interpret and appreciate arts and technologies associated to non-verbal communication tools; the ability to design, organise and assess learning contexts in line with childhood diversity, gender equality and respect for human rights, and the ability to reflect on and research educational practice in an attempt to improve teaching and promote innovative projects.

WHAT WILL YOU LEARN?

Students will acquire personal/relational **competences** including, amongst others, the ability to promote coexistence and peaceful conflict resolution; competences related to the academic disciplines, like the ability to analyse the implication of information and communication technologies on education; and professional competences such as those related to the abilities needed for teaching languages in multicultural and multilingual situations.

QUALITY ASSURANCE COMMISSION

The Quality Assurance Committee (CGQ) gathers all of the information regarding the degree programme (survey reports, data, statistics, complaints, suggestions, etc.) and analyses them.



WHAT WILL YOU BE ABLE TO DO ONCE YOU FINISH?

- ➔ The Degree in Early Childhood Education certifies graduates to work as early childhood school teachers.
- ➔ The degree enables access to the speciality of Educational Guidance and Counselling if students have taken the University Masters in Teaching Training.
- ➔ Other academic pathways from the selection of current postgraduate courses are open to graduates.

HIGH-QUALITY OFFICIAL STUDY

Legislation requires that official Spanish Degrees receive positive evaluations by the **National Agency for Quality Assessment and Accreditation (ANECA)**. This process is called verification, and it serves to ensure that the development programme in which you will participate will provide the skills and learning results that it is supposed to. Bachelor's programmes are subject to assessment and are continuously improved upon in order to guarantee their prestige and recognition within Europe.

TRAVEL AND LEARN

The UIB offers students the chance to take part in different exchange and mobility programmes:

- ➔ Exchange and mobility programmes: to complete part of your studies at another university in Spain, the European Union, and around the world, or to get work experience at businesses in the European Union, managed by the International Relations Service.
- ➔ Volunteer work experience and projects with university development cooperation programmes in least developed countries, run through the development cooperation programmes managed by the Cooperation for Development and Solidarity Office.
