Teaching methodology

21145 Business English follows astrongface-to-face learning approach; for this reason, students should attend their weekly lessons regularly (those students who cannot attend lessons, please refer to the Article 7 of the Reglament Acadèmic - Matrícula d'estudiants a temps parcial).

Alternative assessment dates will not be offered to any student except in those cases mentioned in the Article 26.60f the Reglament Acadèmic.

The student must obtain a minimum score of 5out of 10 in the Final Exam in order to pass the subject. In those cases where the mathematical average is higher than 5, and the final examination scores lower than a 5, the student will have a 4.5 on his or her marks record, according to the the article 26.7 of the Reglament Acadèmic.

The use of cell phones and other electronic devices is not permitted in the classroom. Laptops will be only accepted if they are necessary for the tasks related to course activities. Any electronic device (including laptops or mobile phones) are NOT allowed in the classroom during test practice, or examinations, except when directly specified by the teacher.


